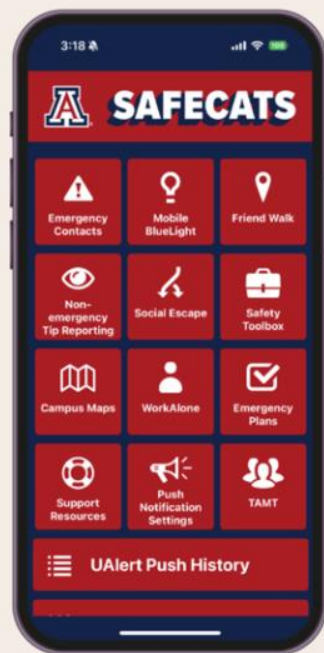

GOOD TO KNOW

- ▶ Gift aid (grants & scholarships) are accepted automatically
- ▶ Financial aid is offered based on the assumption of full time enrollment (12 units)
- ▶ Loans need to be accepted **by your student/you** before funds will release to account

Financial aid is usually split evenly for the school year

Half in the fall semester

Half in the spring semester



NEED TO KNOW



► Common items that hold the release of financial aid (find in UAccess Student Center):

- Less than full time enrollment (12 units is full time)

- UAccess To Do Items

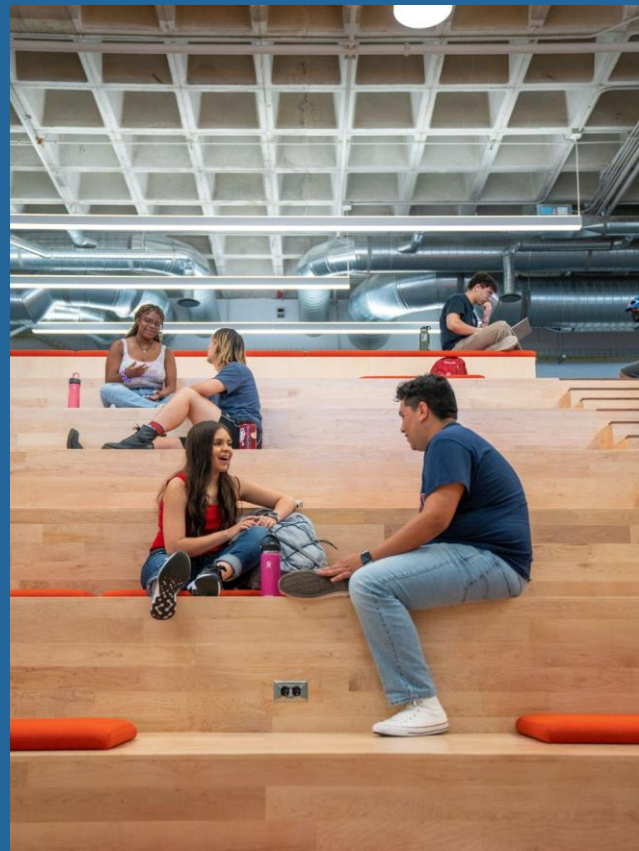
- Submission of final high school transcripts to Admissions

- Loans: Completion of Entrance Counseling/Master Promissory Note

► Balance is due first day of classes

RENEWING FINANCIAL AID

- ▶ Most types of gift aid (grants & scholarships) can be renewed each year
- ▶ File the FAFSA every year!
Priority Filing Date: March 1st
- ▶ Review specific renewal requirements for scholarships (continuous enrollment, units and cumulative GPA)
- ▶ Apply for more scholarships through Scholarship Universe



NEW FOR 2026-27

- ▶ New parent borrowers may only borrow up to \$20,000 annually or \$65,000 in aggregate per dependent in the Parent PLUS Loan.
- ▶ Private loans may be utilized in addition to Parent PLUS, or instead of Parent PLUS to help with other educational and living expenses.
- ▶ Private loan terms vary. Compare and contrast through our website!

May - August

- Complete all To Do List items/holds in UAccess Student Center



Mid-July

- Student & Parent PLUS loans open for 2026/2027
- Students can begin to accept Federal Work-Study



August

- Fall 2026 disbursements will begin to post to students' Bursar account **the week of August 17th**

- Service ends at 7:30 p.m., late night transportation services are provided through Night Cat by Lyft.
- Stay informed with the Transloc app or Cat Tran Tracker.

Meal Plans

MEAL PLAN REQUIREMENTS

- First-time first-year students living on campus and all Honors Village Residents are required to have a Swipe Meal Plan.
- Students living off-campus are encouraged to purchase a Meal Plan to ensure they are able to eat while on campus.
- The default Meal Plan assignment is the 12-Swipe Plan.
- FERPA regulations prevent us from sharing certain information with parents or guardians.
- Meal Plan selection is June 1st through July 22nd.
- Meal Plans are purchased for the full academic year.

Students are responsible for their Meal Plan which includes informed usage, initiating plan change requests, and following up on any billing issues you notice individually or as a family.



MEAL PLANS BREAKDOWN

Swipe Plans include three types of value that work together to cover your meals and snacks on campus:



Swipes

Used to pay for meals at on-campus dining locations.

- Swipes have a value of \$11.50 at all retail locations.
- Swipes are loaded monthly and must be used in the month that they are issued.
- Swipes do not rollover to the next month.
- Swipes are best used at all-you-care-to-eat locations by saving an average of three dollars per meal.



Dining Dollars Plus

Help cover purchases that are more or less than the value of a Swipe.

- Automatically covers any remaining balance when a Swipe does not match the total or when purchase is less than the value of a Swipe.
- Can be used on campus and at select off-campus locations when linked to Grubhub.
- Reloadable at any time.



Guest Meals

Allow you to bring friends or family to dine with you.

- A set number of guest meals are included each year.
- Guest meals can be used only when the Swipe Plan holders is present.
- Valid at on-campus dining locations

No matter the plan chosen, your mobile CatCard serves as your gateway to your Meal Plan.





SWIPE MEAL PLANS

First-time first-year students living on campus and all residents of Honors Village are required to have a Swipe Meal Plan. Returning students and off-campus residents may select any plan.

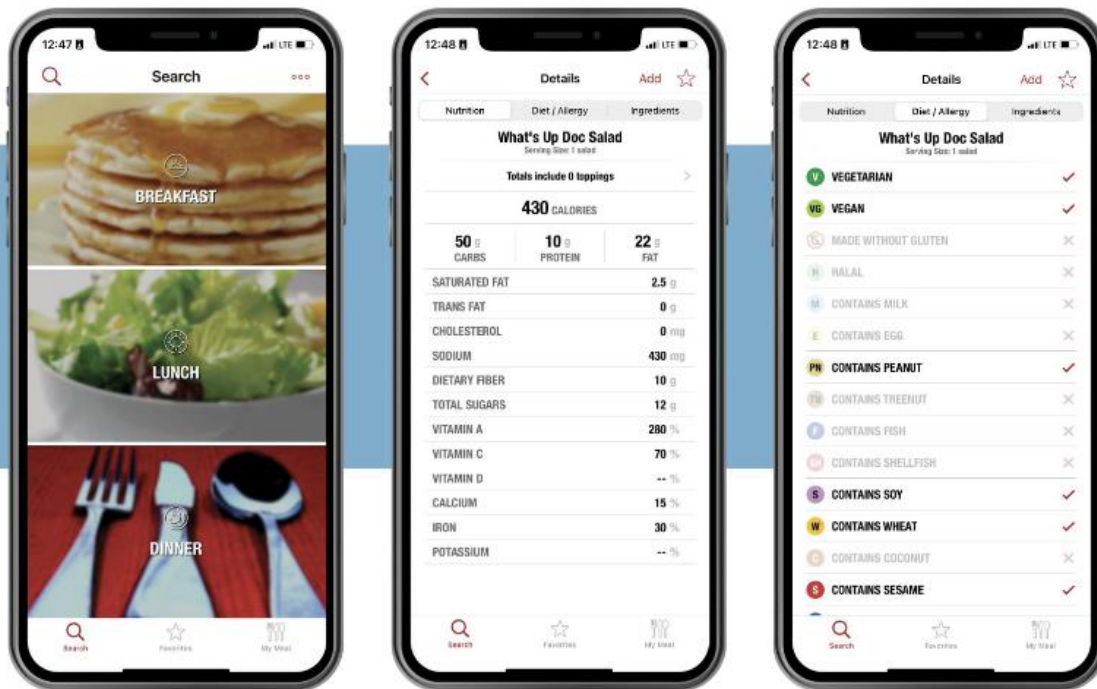
MEAL PLAN SELECTION TIMELINE

TIMELINE	DATES	DETAILS
MEAL PLAN PURCHASES BEGIN	JUNE 1	Students living off-campus may purchase a Meal Plan. Students living on campus will be prompted to select their Meal Plan through their My UAHome housing portal.
BURSAR BILLING BEGINS	JULY 22	Meal Plan charges will be applied to Bursar account. Further changes must be made through the Meal Plans office.
SWIPES ACTIVE	AUGUST 17	August monthly Swipes and Dining Dollars Plus will be available for use. No Swipes are allocated for Move In Week. Students on campus during this time can purchase a Block 10 plan to supplement their August Swipes allocation.
LAST DAY FOR DOWNGRADES	SEPTEMBER 6	Final downgrades can be made to plan up until 11:59pm.
GREEK PLAN CHANGES	SEPTEMBER 20	Final downgrades can be made to plan up until 11:59pm.
FINALS WEEK (NO SWIPES)	DECEMBER 11-17	No Swipes are allocated for Finals Week. Students on campus during this time can purchase a Block 10 plan to supplement their December Swipe allocation. Dining Dollars Plus will be available for use during this time.
LAST DAY FOR MEAL PLANS	DECEMBER 17	Any remaining Swipes expire at 11:59 pm.

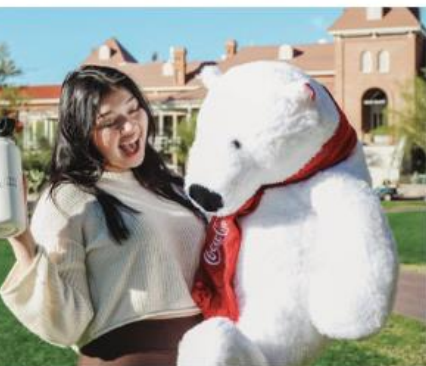

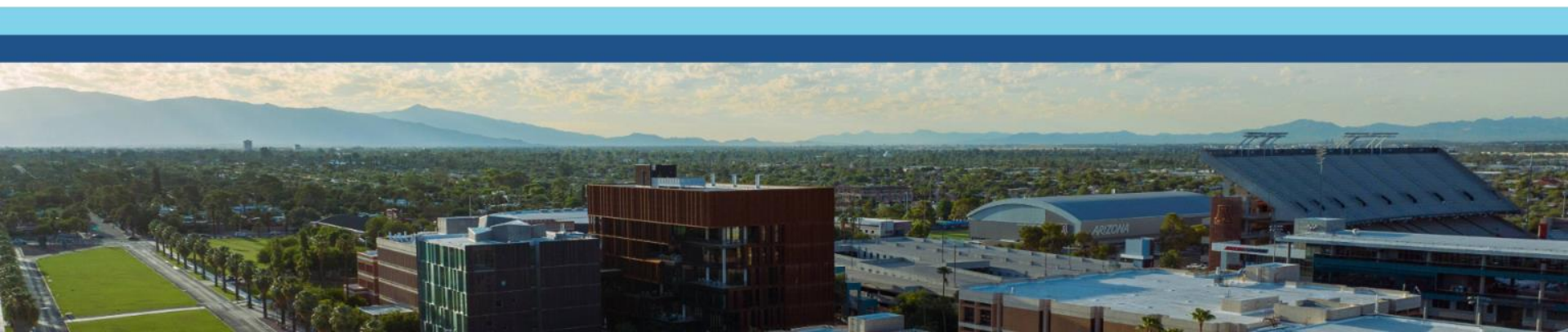

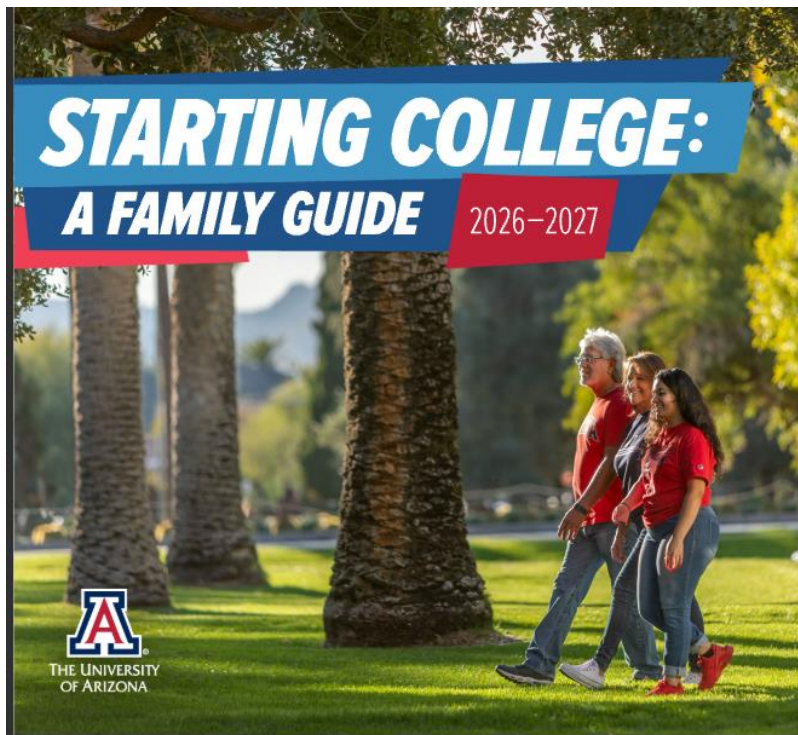
